### Jan Dennis Henke (1936-2024)

As is so true with our hobby, this grand 'world of money', we are witnessing and enduring the passing of those who paved the way before us. Such is the recent passing of Jan Dennis Henke, of Fairfield, California, 1939—2024, at age 84.

Most reading this eulogy may not have heard or known Jan but from the late 1970s well into this century, Jan was the presence----*the prominent presence*----in woods and coin club medals, actively and avidly collecting, designing, coordinating sales for local coin clubs here in Northern California, and promoting woods and coin club medals, all these via telephone and typewriter. Jan never did anything via the Internet or a PC or email: it was from his small desk in a spare bedroom and the kitchen table.

Once when a group was to meet in Chattanooga, Tennessee, he telephoned that city's Mayor Office, obtained the City Logo, and designed the group's medal. Jan carried an extensive correspondence with like hobbyists around California and across our entire nation. He assembled, via telephone calls and written inquiries, one of the few *complete* California State Numismatic Association (CSNA) club medal sets.

His records, all handwritten without any correction liquid or cross-outs, were complete and correct, always in black pen. The same applied to his typed newsletters, the WEST WOOD, SILVER NOTES, and MONEYGRAM. Nothing fancy with art or design: but informative and friendly, and always mailed on time.

Jan was the keystone and cornerstone for the Fairfield (California) Coin Club, the Solano (California) Silver Round Club, and the Western Wooden Money Club. His service included the Vallejo (California) Numismatic Society and the Northern California Numismatic Association.

When he was asked to do something, it was done, and done properly, all from his small desk, with its typewriter, and kitchen table, the latter always covered with woods, letters received and to be mailed, and handwritten notes.

A proud Iowan and United States Air Force veteran plus married for fifty-eight years, Jan reveled and rallied for 'our world of money', again all from his small desk in a spare bedroom and his kitchen table. In addition, his cooking was also good, particularly his smoked turkey.

Jan represented the countless and forgotten across our grand nation and in Canada that make this 'world of money' the *hobby of people*, far from the bright lights and august assemblages at national gatherings. Like others before and after, he served over self.

Coin apps, like coin snap, give incorrect and misleading information and should not be used. People who are selling damaged coins as mint errors or no mint mark coins are a huge issue as well.

AI created videos and coin apps are one of the worst things you can watch or have on your phone. If you're going to sell cool and interesting damaged coins, then you need to know that and tell the buyer the same thing. Truth and honesty are all that is needed in this hobby, not telling people your damaged coins are rare mint errors.
